

Orcas Island Yacht Club and Ullman Sails are pleased to invite you to the second annual East Sound Spring Regatta on Saturday & Sunday, April 27-28, 2019.

Rules: The regatta will be governed by The Racing Rules of Sailing (2017-2020), the prescriptions of the U.S.

Sailing Association, and the Class Rules of One-Design classes, except as changed by this Notice of Race

and by the Sailing Instructions.

Fleets: We plan on at least three divisions, including a PHRF class; one-design classes for five or more one-design

boats (Martin 242, Santa Cruz 27, etc.); and a cruiser's division. Cruisers without a PHRF certificate will be

assigned a rating.

Courses: We plan to have buoy racing and long-distance races in front of the mansion and in the north end of East

Sound. Temporary race marks will be used this year. The race committee may also use islands, rocks or navigational buoys for long distance courses. A course sheet will be provided in the Sailing instructions.

Schedule: A mandatory skipper's meeting will be held at 0900 on Saturday with first notice planned for 1030. No

signals will be made after 1500 on Sunday.

Entry fee: The entry fee is \$50 and includes two days of racing and one breakfast ticket for Sunday morning (additional

breakfast tickets are \$5 each). Advance registration is required.

Moorage: Limited moorage is available at Rosario Resort. Please reserve your dock space early. Call Terry at

360.376.2152 at extension 700 to make your reservation.

Accommodations: Rooms are available at Rosario Resort. For reservations call 360.376.2222. Camping is also available in

nearby Moran State Park.

Social events: Many activities for the family are available and a spa, full bar, and two restaurants are on site. Breakfast will

be available before racing on Sunday. An awards ceremony will be held immediately after racing on Sunday.

Safety: Boats must meet the <u>US Sailing Safety Equipment Requirements for "Nearshore."</u> Each boat must have a

VHF. Charts of the racing area are required to be on board.

Disclaimer of liability Competitors participate in the regatta entirely at their own risk. See RRS 4, Decision to Race. The

organizing authority will not accept any liability for material damage or personal injury or death sustained in

conjunction with, prior to, during, or after the regatta.

Insurance The owner must have third-party liability insurance for their boat, applicable for sailboat racing, having a

minimum coverage of \$400,000. If the owner is not on board, the policy must be valid for a non-owner

person in charge.
